Ticket Policy

- Subscribers are guaranteed renewal of their seats until May 31, 2020. Seats are then assigned on a first-come, first-served, basis.
- Our season subscription and package play offerings do NOT include the holiday play.

Refunds & Exchanges

We are unable to provide refunds, but offer exchanges with the following stipulations:

- Season subscribers may exchange their tickets for another performance of the same play, subject to seat availability.
- Exchanges must occur at least 72 hours before the performance date shown on the original ticket.
- Exchanges and ticket replacements are subject to a \$2 administration fee per ticket.

Box Office Hours

The ticket window is not open on public holidays.

During the 5 main plays of the season, the ticket window is open:

- One week before the opening night of each production
 - 5:00 to 7:00 PM, Monday through Friday
 - 10:00 AM to Noon, on Saturday
 - 5:00 to 7:30 PM Tuesday through Saturday during performance weeks

Performances start promptly at **7:30pm**. Times vary for our holiday show – please ensure you check your ticket(s).

A Bad Year for Tomatoes by John Patrick

Directed by Ron Gardner September 15-19 and 22-26, 2020

Fed up with the pressures and demands of her acting career, the famous Myra Marlowe leases a house in the tiny New England hamlet of Beaver Haven and settles down to write her autobiography. But dealing with her nosy, omnipresent neighbors is a different matter. In an attempt to shoo them away, and gain some privacy, Myra invents a mad, homicidal sister – who is kept locked in an upstairs room, but who occasionally escapes long enough to scare off uninvited visitors. The ruse works well, at first, but complications result when the local handyman develops an affection for "Sister Sadie".

Doubt, A Parable by John Patrick Shanley

Directed by Beverley Brooks November 3-7 and 10-14, 2020

In this brilliant and powerful drama, Sister Aloysius, a Bronx school principal, takes matters into her own hands when she suspects the young Father Flynn of improper relations with one of the male students.

Winner of the 2005 Pulitzer Prize and Tony Award.

Months on End by Craig Pospisil

Directed by Clare Flockton February 2-6 and 9-13, 2021

In a series of comic scenes—one for each month of the year—we follow the intertwined worlds of a circle of friends and family whose lives are poised between happiness and heartbreak. The diverse scenes and characters in this winning play come together to create an experience encompassing a range of emotions from happiness to sorrow and everything in between.

Ken Ludwig's "The Game's Afoot" or ("Holmes for the Holidays")

Directed by Jim Clarke, March 23-27 and March 30-April 3, 2021

It is December 1936, and Broadway star William Gillette, admired the world over for his leading role in the play Sherlock Holmes, has invited his fellow cast members to his Connecticut castle for a weekend of revelry. But when one of the guests is stabbed to death, the festivities in this isolated house of tricks and mirrors quickly turn dangerous. It is then up to Gillette himself, as he assumes the persona of his beloved Holmes, to track down the killer before the next victim appears. The danger and hilarity are non-stop in this glittering whodunit set during the Christmas holidays.

Twelfth Night (or What You Will) by William Shakespeare

Directed by Jim Holmes, May 11-15 and 18-22, 2021

Loved by audiences for generations, Twelfth Night; or, What You Will, finds Viola shipwrecked on the shores of Illyria. Believing her twin brother has drowned, and that she is now alone in the world, Viola disguises herself as a eunuch -- taking the name Cesario -- to work in the court of Illyria's Count Orsino. Hilarity and madness ensue when Viola then finds herself falling in love with Orsino while at the same time being tasked with helping him win the heart of the unresponsive Olivia who finds herself falling in love with the man she thinks is Cesario. A romantic comedy rife with pain and triumph, transformation and redemption, love and rejection.

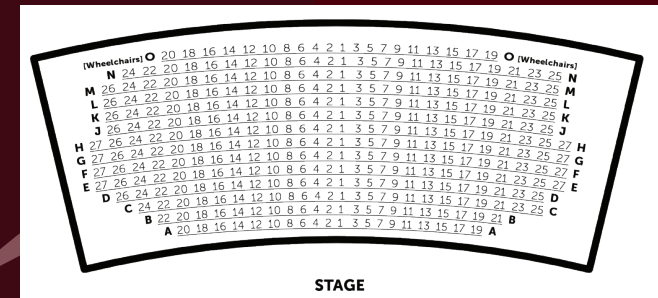
The Ron Maslin Playhouse is a modern 350-seat theatre situated just off Terry Fox Drive, south of the Queensway in Kanata.

SEATING CHART

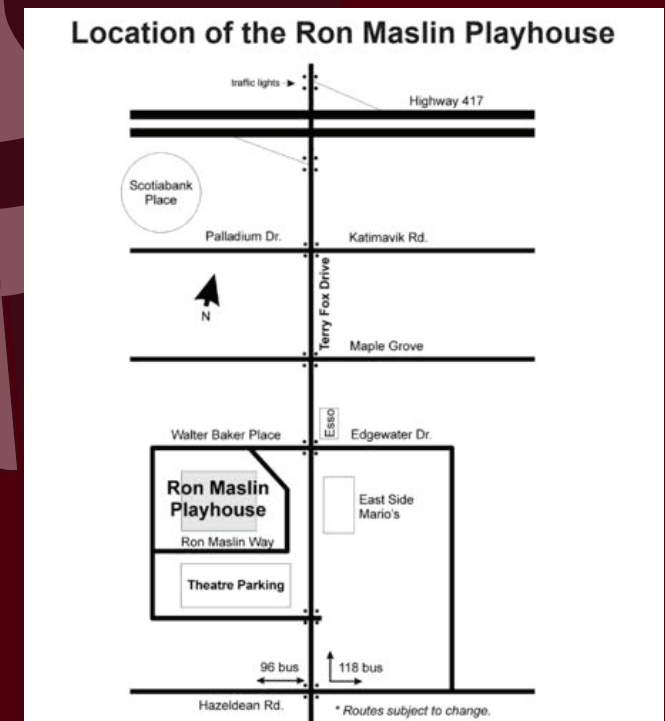
Capacity
